The main branch of the York County Library, which is located in Old Town Rock Hill, is closed now through September 25th for major repairs. These repairs include replacement of the roof and boiler, as well as resurfacing and painting of the parking lot.

Although the library is closed, the bookmobile will still be available. It will be parked at the corner of Dave Lyle Boulevard and E. White Street from Monday through Friday from 11am to 7pm. Customers may return items and pick up their books on hold.

Whenever the bookmobile is closed, the book drop box at the library will be available for dropping off

borrowed items.

York County Library branches in Fort Mill, Clover, York, and Lake Wylie will continue to be open during their normal operating hours, offering the same services available in Rock Hill.

The library is expected to re-open on September 26th and apologizes for any inconvenience.
