Business Spotlight

Arts Council of York County



The Arts Council of York County is a private, non-profit organization based in Old Town. It seeks to “connect people through art, culture, dance, drama, and music.” Its vision is to “create and support a thriving, diverse, and vibrant community in York County.” The Arts Council manages and programs three arts venues:

- ◆ **Center for the Arts:** This building houses the Arts Council’s main business offices, several artist studios, and three art galleries: Dalton Gallery, Perimeter Gallery, and Lewandowski Classroom Gallery. Center for the Arts is located at 121 E. Main St.
- ◆ **Gettys Art Center:** This building once served as Rock Hill’s courthouse and post office. It is now home to Rock Hill Pottery Center, Social Design House, Friday Arts Project, The Cordial Churchman, The South Carolina Arts Alliance, and several artist studios. In addition, the former courtroom space often serves as a venue for both performing and visual arts. The Gettys Art Center is located at 201 E. Main St.
- ◆ **Community Performance Center:** This building is Old Town’s primary performing arts venue. The Arts Council’s annual Performing Arts Series is programmed here. The York County Ballet, Rock Hill Community Theater, and Remedy Church can also be found in this space. The Community Performance Center is located at 249 E. Main Street.
