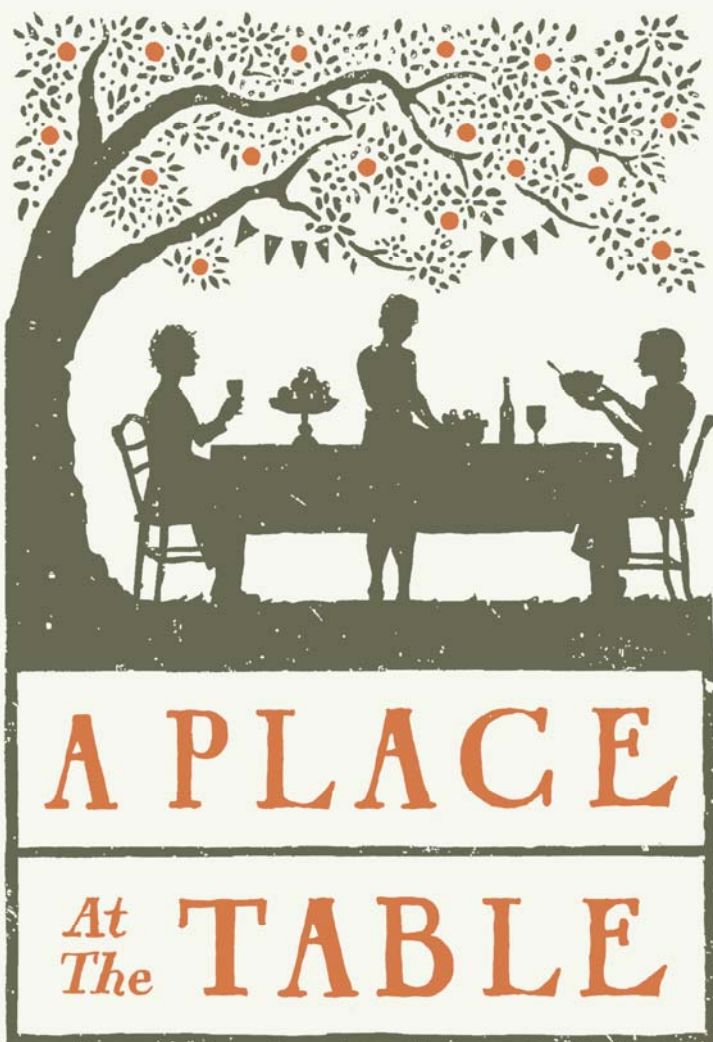

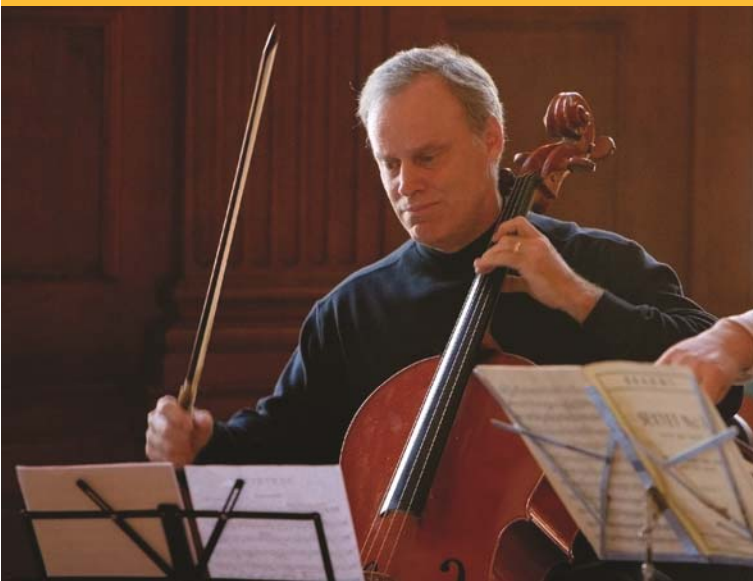

The Love Shack



The Love Shack, which opened in August, is Old Town's newest local barber shop. While named after owner Jon Love, the name is also reminiscent of the B-52's song "The Love Shack," which was released in 1989. Similar to the message of the song, Love wants people to have fun and be happy while having their hair cut. He and manager, Susan Averitt, really enjoy being around people and having the opportunity to personally get to know their customers.

Both Love and Averitt are Master Barbers who have been hairstylists for more than 13 years. After years of working together for another barber shop in Charlotte, they decided to open their own shop here in Rock Hill. They chose their location in Old Town because they wanted to be in a visible spot that was close to both Winthrop University and to a national brand store—Earth Fare, in this case. The Love Shack serves men, women, and children. Services include razor cuts, haircuts and styles, highlights, hair coloring, hot lather shaves, and updos. Appointments are available, but walk-ins are also welcome.
