Now Open in Old Town: Millstone Pizza and Taphouse

Millstone Pizza and Taphouse is Old Town’s newest restaurant. Childhood friends Brendan Kuhlkin and David Clapp are the team behind the project. After deciding to bring New York quality Neapolitan wood-

fired pizzas to Rock Hill, along with an extensive selection of craft beers, they traveled around New York and Chicago to sample the best of the best. Upon returning, they incorporated elements of their favorite pizzerias into what is now Millstone Pizza and Taphouse.

Millstone uses only the best ingredients, from locally-made farm-to-table cheeses to custom-made meats from New York to Caputo 00 flour from Italy. Pizzas are cooked at 900° in a custom hickory-fired oven. At any given time, there are also 40 craft beers on tap.
