## **Unveiling of Old Town Information Kiosk**

In 2005, a tourism study indicated that visitors rely on directional signage when visiting an unknown city, and local residents often need assistance to easily find major attractions and points of interest. In response, the Convention and Visitors Bureau implemented a county-wide program for the installation of kiosks, and the City of Rock Hill implemented a wayfinding program that includes gateways into the City, street-level signs and banners, and pedestrian-level signs.

On April 1st, a ceremony was held to unveil the City of Rock Hill's first information kiosk. It is located in Old Town on Main Street at Elk Avenue. This kiosk is a four-sided, pedestrian-level unit that features information about festivals, events, and attractions in Rock Hill and in York County, as well as information about businesses and happenings in Old Town.

Funding for the Old Town Information Kiosk was provided by York County and the City of Rock Hill.
